Greetings, Branson Christian Church.

I would like to speak directly to you about church finance and how to cope during this COVID-19 shutdown. We will not be able to collect our usual Sunday morning offering----and will not have the steady income from our thrift store. However, church expenses continue; therefore, it becomes incumbent upon us all to keep our church fiscally healthy, even as we all endeavor to keep ourselves healthy. I would like to suggest a couple of ways to continue normal giving practices. One, you can simply mail your gift, using the good old US Mail. The address is:

Two, you can drop your gift by the church office. Pastor Al has removed the tape off the back of the door that prevented the mail slot from being used. This is located on the door near where the mail box is now, just off the main sidewalk. It was taped up to prevent cold air from entering the office area. The mail slot has a lever you can pull to open-----and close after you put mail in. This is a very safe pass-through.

This precious church family should be commended for faithful giving through the years. I am confident we can get through this together---while keeping our beautiful church sound and well.

Pastor Minor's Message of the Month...

Colors for the Christian Year

The Disciples of Christ Denomination celebrate two cycles in the Christian year: The Christmas Cycle (Advent-Christmas-Epiphany) and the Easter Cycle (Lent-Easter-Pentecost). Located within each cycle are a preparatory season which is symbolized by the color purple and a festival season symbolized by the color white. Following each cycle there is an ordinary time of growth symbolized by the color green. You can then understand the sequence of seasons using purple, white, and green in this order twice a year.

Purple represents penitence and royalty during the preparatory seasons of Advent and Lent. The color blue is sometimes used to represent hope during the Advent.

Primarily white, and sometimes gold, is used during the Christmas and Easter seasons. White is also used at weddings and baptisms as well as funerals.

Green is the color of growth used in the seasons after the Epiphany and Pentecost, except when specials days call for white or red.

Red is a color of fire symbolizing the Holy Spirit. It is used on the Day of Pentecost and also as the color of the blood of Christ. It is also used on ordinations and also during Holy Week, beginning with Passion/Palm Sunday.

These colors are based on long traditions but other colors are being used in Christian churches. I hope this may clarify the different colors you see ink church and why we use them.

We are thankful for your continued faithful giving and support during this time when we were unable to gather. The two methods of giving are working quite well—by either dropping your gift through the mail slot in the church office door or mailing it to the church.

Even though we experienced a below average offering in March, (see notes below) many are stepping up and coming through at this difficult time. It is understood too, that some of our precious members are going through financial difficulties due to COVID-19 and unable to contribute at this time. Our prayer is that God will bless each one alike and bring us all through this time, even stronger than before.

Below is the income/expense report ending March 31,2020:

Operating income MARCH \$ 13,784.84 Operating expense MARCH \$ 14,685.07 Year to date income \$ 35,933.08 Year to date expense \$ 39,842.44

Note:

Operational expenses during March were within normal range because the church was open for part of the month. We anticipate lower operational expenses for the month of April with church facilities being closed during the month.


General Fund operating income does not reflect the \$6,000 designated for the stained glass fund and an expense of \$2,139 for purchase of glass.

The stained glass project is progressing. Below is a picture of the middle panel that is in the final stages of completion. There are many steps to designing the stained glass window including; cutting the glass for the design, applying foil tape to each piece, soldering over the foil to bond the glass together, solder a zinc frame to support the glass on the front and back. Then it is cleaned, a patina is applied to protect the solder and then waxed to a beautiful shine. Just to give you an idea of the time involved in this project, the Bonds have spent almost 400 hours on the project thus far, not counting the nearly 500 hours of design time.

We are blessed beyond measure for the gift they are providing.





From the Board Chair...

As I write this message, I find myself with conflicting emotions. I have tried not to listen to the news often or read the many articles, posts, comments, etc. that can be both encouraging and discouraging, but it is almost unavoidable for some of these things to not infiltrate our personal world. So how do we sort the messages? There are strong feelings on all sides of the pandemic, how it is being handled, how long will our lives be dictated by the virus, what information do we believe to be accurate, what shapes our thoughts/views and the list goes on. Our experiences will be as unique as we are.

It is both a positive and negative pull on our emotions. We see light in the many acts of kindness and appreciation, an outpouring of support for those hurting during this crisis, uplifting stories of how love and concern is expressed for our families and neighbors during this time of separation, sewing machines being dusted off to make masks, selfless acts to minister to the sick, many continuing to work in jobs that put their lives at risk and the overflowing creativity spawned by necessity. And, sadly, the negative that can pull us deep into dark places and can be depressing. Not just negative messages but the sadness we feel for those who are struggling because of the loss of their job and financial security, educating children at home, stress, those are who sick, and dying, alone, can pull on our heartstrings. The messages that are divisive and polarizing that tear us apart at a time when we need each other more than ever, mean spirited acts that hurt us at our core, judgement, blaming, misunderstandings, and simply not listening to one another. So how do we navigate these pulls on our emotions?

I certainly don't have the answer to that question, but I have hope. Hope that we can find peace, understanding and wisdom from the one who loves us unconditionally, the one who is always with us, our God. We can spend time in prayer and meditation, asking God for direction and wisdom. Believing that in this time when our "normal" lives are interrupted that we can, and do, depend on His guidance and find hope. We draw our strength from God and rely on His presence to get through each day and support one another on this journey. Love God, Love your neighbor.

As 2020 began, it was suggested there were 366 opportunities to make a difference. As the New Year began no one expected it to be quite this challenging. Nonetheless, I know that so many of you are rising to the occasion and continuing to find opportunities to serve and make a difference, big or small, they all count. Thank you for being the body of Christ during this time of uncertainty and continuing to express the love of Christ through your words, actions and sharing your gifts. I am blessed to be a part of a community of believers who Love God and Love their neighbors in ways yet to be discovered. I miss you and look forward to seeing you soon.

We were unable to have the April board meeting, but the work of the church continues. Following are some of the <u>highlights:</u>

- Although we were unable to come together during Holy Week and celebrate as planned, we continued the annual prayer chain and joined in the Palm Sunday and Easter services from our homes.
- As you know, our staff, Pastor Al, Ginger, Rod and Annette are continuing to work, mostly from home, and at the church, as necessary. Thanks to each of them for continuing to keep things running as normally as possible.
- Jan and Ron Bond are actively working on the stained-glass window project.
- With the generous gift of time and talent the weekly worship service is being planned and made available via Facebook.
- The church offered our facilities to host a Red Cross Blood Drive coordinated by Pat Davis.
- Thank you to the lawn and garden "Angels" for taking care of the church grounds.
- Our sister church, Ozark Mountain Christian Church, have generously offered to donate Chalice Hymnals, that will replace the current one in use at BCC, along with bibles from their congregation. Please hold them in your prayers as they continue through the transition of selling their building.

As we begin to plan how and when we will gather again in fellowship, I ask for your patience and understanding. We haven't done this before, so as we take the necessary steps for opening the church for worship services and activities, they may look different. Please be in prayer for guidance and wisdom for planning and decisions.

We are not in the same boat

I heard that we are all in the same boat, but it's not like that. We are in the same storm, but not in the same boat. Your ship could be shipwrecked and mine might not be. Or vice versa.

For some, quarantine is optimal. A moment of reflection, of reconnection, easy in flip flops, with a cocktail or coffee. For others, this is a desperate financial & family crisis.

For some that live alone they're facing endless loneliness. While for others it is peace, rest & time with their mother, father, sons & daughters.

With the \$600 weekly increase in unemployment some are bringing in more money to their households than they were working. Others are working more hours for less money due to pay cuts or loss in sales.

Some families of four just received \$3400 from the stimulus while other families of four saw \$0.

Some were concerned about getting a certain candy for Easter while others were concerned if there would be enough bread, milk and eggs for the weekend.

Some want to go back to work because they don't qualify for unemployment and are running out of money. Others are angry with those who break the quarantine.

Some are home spending 2-3 hours/day helping their child with online schooling while others are spending 2-3 hours/day to educate their children on top of a 10-12-hour workday.

Some have experienced the near death of the virus; some have already lost someone from it and some are not sure if their loved ones are going to make it. Others don't believe this is a big deal.

Some have faith in God and expect miracles during this 2020. Others say the worst is yet to come.

So, friends, we are not in the same boat. We are going through a time when our perceptions and needs are completely different.

Each of us will emerge, in our own way, from this storm. It is very important to see beyond what is seen at first glance. Not just looking, actually seeing.

We are all on different ships during this storm experiencing a very different journey.

PENTECOST SPECIAL OFFERING MAY 31 AND JUNE 7



Recently the board met to discuss reopening the church for in-person services. Giving consideration to the guidance provided by state and local officials regarding COVID-19 the decision was made to reopen on Sunday, May 31. To manage the six (6) feet distancing requirement there will be changes to how we "normally" do things. Your patience and understanding are appreciated as we sort through how to best meet the guidelines while providing a safe and healthy environment for you to attend church.

On Sunday, May 31, the church will reopen for in-person worship service, only. All other Sunday morning activities will be suspended at this time including, church school, coffee/social time, Worship and Wonder, choir and bread for visitors.

When you arrive please enter through the Narthex doors, all other doors will remain locked and used for emergency exit only. Just a reminder, there are four handicap parking spaces near the Narthex doors and Liberty Plaza offers a ramp for easy access. The doors will open at 10:25, with one person or family entering at a time, maintaining the six (6) feet distance and directed to seating. Pews will be marked to allow for proper distancing. At the end of the service the congregation will be dismissed, one row at a time, through the Narthex doors.

Communion and Offering will be a bit different. At this time, elders and deacons will not participating with the usual duties, but may be asked to offer support in other ways. We will not be passing the communion or offering trays, instead you will pick up an individual prefilled communion as you enter and offering will be deposited in a box as you exit the sanctuary or a new online option, Givelify that will be announced soon.

Other planning notes....there will only be access to the Narthex restroom during the service, the water fountain will not be accessible so feel free to bring water, if needed; it will be your personal choice to wear a mask as they are not required, and as we have been reminded often to refrain from shaking hands, hugging or standing too close to others. There will be some changes to the order of worship that will be explained before the service.

The service will continue to be recorded for those who choose not to attend in-person services or for those who have discovered Branson Christian Church during our weekly online presence. Because editing the service is very time consuming it will be posted, unedited, as recorded. Each Sunday the service will be posted and available for viewing on Facebook at 6:00 pm.

We are looking forward to gathering again in the fellowship of Christ. Although these changes are not what we hoped for, it is a place to begin worshipping together again. Again, your patience and mercy are requested as we try to navigate this uncharted path. We have missed seeing one another and hopefully these changes will only have to be followed a short time. We are in this together as brothers and sisters in Christ!


From the Board Chair...







From the Board Chair...

A brief overview of the July board meeting:

- ~ The board approved a recommendation from the Finance Committee to change phone/internet services from CenturyLink to Suddenlink. There will be some cost savings and improved internet connection.
- ~ The board approved a recommendation from the Finance Committee for a fundraising project presented by the Vision Committee. The fundraiser will provide a "plumbing tree" placed in the church to display items needed to complete the Handicapped Accessible Restroom project that had been previously approved.
- ~The board approved a Credit Card Policy and Procedure presented by the Finance Committee. This policy/procedure provides guidance for managing and tracking of church issued credit cards.
- ~The board approved a recommendation from the Finance Committee for a revised Finance Committee Policy and Procedure. This was a revision/update of the current policy written and approved in 2012.
- ~ A Key Policy was presented and approved by the board. This policy and procedure provides for the safety and security of church buildings and guidance for the distribution and management of keys for all church property.
- ~The Finance Committee presented a recommendation regarding the distribution of funds received as a gift from Ozark Mountain Christian Church. Following much discussion it was suggested that the Finance Committee consider some of the suggestions and present a recommendation at the August meeting.

A devotion on hope.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.... 1 Corinthians 13:13

It is interesting to notice how the Apostle Paul sandwiches hope between faith and love. Could it not be that Paul so put them in this order because of the relationship that hope has to faith and love? Faith precedes hope, but hope is so closely related to faith, that at times it is impossible to separate the two. One writer of Scripture defined faith, saying that it is "being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see" (Hebrews 11:1). When you have faith in a person, hope is born in your soul. Faith in God produces a hope that rescues you from the despair of the most difficult circumstances. When you trust God to answer your prayer, hope is gradually born in your soul--hope that cannot be defeated.

The message of the Gospel is a simple one that still produces hope in a hopeless world: "God so loved the world that He gave..." In short, it tells us that you are never so far from the cross that you cannot find a lasting hope. The Scripture says that hope which comes as the result of a personal experience with Christ is an anchor to your soul. Hope links you to God as an anchor holds a ship in angry waters.

Sometimes we can feel as though we are being tossed about in troubled waters, but so thankful for the anchor of hope that God provides to see us through these difficult times.

Pastor Minor's Message of the Month ... <u>Labor Day</u>

September 7th is Labor Day, but what exactly is it, and why do we celebrate it?

In the late 1800's, during the Industrial Revolution, the average American worked 12 hour days and 7 days a week in order to try and make a decent living. History tells us that despite restrictions in some states, children as young as five or six worked in factories earning a fraction of what adults made. (Child Labor Laws today prevent this horrendous situation from ever happening again.) Labor unions began to organize to protest the long hours and inadequate wages and force employers to renegotiate less hours and more pay. As we are seeing today, many of these events became extremely violent, e.g., the "Haymarket Riot," of 1886 in which several police officers were killed.

On September 5, 1882, 10,000 workers marched from the City Hall to the Union Square in New York City, celebrating the first Labor Day parade in United States history. The idea of a national "workingmen's holiday," which would be celebrated on the first Monday in September, and many states passed registration for it. Twelve years later, on May 11, 1894, the workers of the Pullman Palace Car Company in Chicago declared a strike in protest of wage cuts and the firing of union representatives. There were years of unrest until on June 28, 1894, President Grover Cleveland signed it into law. The Uniform Monday Holiday Act on June 28, 1968, organized several holidays to make sure they were always celebrated on a Monday to give workers a 3-day weekend.

From the Board Chair...

A brief overview of the July board meeting:

Board meeting highlights:

The Finance Committee will be sending budget worksheets to committee chairs to complete for the 2021 budget planning process.

The Finance Committee presented a revised proposal for the distribution of the \$40,000 gift from Ozark Mountain Christian Church as requested at the July board meeting. The following proposal was presented and approved:

- \$20,000 will be placed in a designated account for emergency use only. The funds will be earmarked for unexpected expenses that are above and beyond the budget. Such as: major expense to replace an air conditioner, roof leaks or electrical issues, etc.
- · \$8,000 is designated to the be placed in the By the Way Thrift Store account and shown as income to make up for lost revenue due to the closure of the shop during COVID 19.
- \$8,000 is designated to be added to the existing Building Fund account. These funds can be used for building projects, with board approval.
- \$4,000 is designated for the purpose of identifying an outreach project. The Outreach Committee will be responsible for identifying a need, cause or causes that will benefit and make a difference in the local community within the next six months.

A proposal was presented and approved for installation of a new copy machine for the office.

• The proposal from Corporate Business Systems (our current provider) will provide a new Canon copier that will meet the needs of operation for the church. The proposal details include: 60 month lease agreement; decreased per copy cost; no annual service fee; all service, toner, parts and labor at no charge for the duration of the lease; updated system and functions compatible with the computer operating system; training and support and a savings of \$964.00 annually. Installation will occur within the next few weeks.

The Vision Committee will begin planning for the ADA complaint restroom remodel soon. Fund-raising efforts have reached over half the funds projected for the remodel and will continue until the \$15,000 goal is achieved.

The Worship Committee suggested reverting to the former order of worship beginning in September. Elders and Deacons will be contacted to determine their level of participation and based on their response the consensus was to move forward with the change. More information will be shared, as available.

Pastor Minor's Message of the Month



Is it Fall or Autumn?



Fall and Autumn are both interchangeable. It is the season of pumpkin spice and everything nice; football and wonderful weather, but why do we prefer to say "fall" far more than "autumn?"

Both words were known as "harvest" which is the earliest name for this season, and both stem from Britain. During the 1800's, American English and British English made the unofficial word of choice for each nation which still stands today: fall is the choice for Americans and autumn for Britain.

In America, fall likely comes from the, "falling of leaves," or perhaps from daylight savings time of "spring ahead, fall forward." No one seems to know for sure but what everyone does know is how beautiful the leaves become.

Why do the leaves change to such beautiful colors? There is a transformation process which changes the leaves from green to blazing reds, yellows, and orange. This is due to the pigmentation in the leaves. This pigment is called chlorophyll which aids the process of photosynthesis. Leaves contain other pigments as well but the main theme is a transformation that takes place.

The Bible tells us that there is a transformation that takes place when we decide to make Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. The Bible says we are to be transformed by the, "renewing of our mind." We emerge as the people God has made us to be. The nine fruit of the Spirit describe what that process looks like in Galatians 5:22, 23: "Love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control."

The month of November celebrates Thanksgiving, and our church staff is very thankful for all of you. May God's love be with you.


