The Story of the Chalice Logo

The logo of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is a red chalice with a white St. Andrew's Cross. The chalice represents the centrality of communion to the life of the church. The cross of Saint Andrew is a reminder of the ministry of each person and the importance of evangelism, and recalls the denomination's Scottish Presbyterian ancestry.

After the 1968 General Assembly, the Administrative Committee charged a subcommittee with the task of proposing a symbol for the church. Hundreds of designs were submitted, but none seemed right. By November the Deputy General Minister and President, William Howland, suggested that the committee's staff consultant and chairperson agree on a specific proposal and bring it back to the committee: that meant Robert L. Friedly of the Office of Interpretation and Ronald E. Osborn.

On January 20, 1970, the two men sat down for lunch. With a red felt-tip pen, Osborn began to scrawl a Saint Andrew's cross circumscribed inside a chalice on his placemat.

Immediately, Friedly dispatched the crude drawing to Bruce Tilsley, a commercial artist and member of Central Christian Church of Denver, with the plea that he prepare an artistic version of the ideas. Tilsley responded with two or three sketches, from which was selected the now-familiar red chalice.

Use of the proposed symbol became so prevalent that there was little debate when official adoption was considered at the 1971 General Assembly. The chalice is a registered trademark of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Congregations and ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) are free to use the chalice in publications, web sites and other media.

Because most congregations call themselves "Christian Churches," the chalice has become a simple way to identify Disciples of Christ Churches through signage, letterhead, and other forms of publicity.

As we look back on the year 2020 we remember many things that went wrong; however, there were many things that went right for our church.

After talking about putting our church service on the internet for the past couple of years, we finally did it due to the pandemic. March 15th was the last church service as the pandemic caused

church services to be cancelled. Our church staff began working from home. The very next Sunday I was excited to do our first "live stream" at home from my I-pad. There were 368 views. Baptismal classes for 6 young people were continued through FaceTime.

On April 3rd, we began filming the service (with no audience) and on April 5th showed the service at 10:45 a.m. There were 541 views. On Easter morning our service drew 922 views which included the baptism of 6 young people who had finished their baptismal classes. On May 31st, our church was reopened for regular church services and was available to be viewed online.

On September 27th, the Stained Glass in the sanctuary was unveiled revealing the artistic and painstaking work of Ron and Jan Bond. The remodeling of the Fellowship Hall bathrooms is almost completed. There were more events that have taken place but I am running out of room in this column.

Most of all, as the Pastor, I am very thankful to all of you as you have been extremely generous and kind. On behalf of the entire church staff I pray God's love will be with you as we enter into the Year 2021.

Membership Committee Report


The Membership Committee served all the donated cookies and 10 gallons of hot cocoa at the Adoration Parade on Dec. 6!



Pastor Message

"And we have known and believed the love that God has for us. God is love, and he who abides in love abides in God, and God in him." I John 4:7-16

This is the fundamental Scripture of the early church. They would have described themselves in terms of love.

February is the month that features Valentine's Day. A day when people throughout the country reflect on love, Valentine cards, and chocolate candy. In 1923, Clara and Russell Stover began making candy in the kitchen of their Denver bungalow home. It soon became a small business known as, "Mrs. Stover's Bungalow Candies." Within a year they opened stores in Denver, Kansas City, Lincoln, Omaha and St. Louis. In 1928, with their business expanding they opened their first ice cream factory in Kansas City, Missouri. In 1943, the company changed the name to, "Russell Stover Candies," and Russell became known as, "The West's Candy Man."

In 1995, "Forest Gump," won Best Picture at the Academy Awards. One of Forest's most memorable lines takes place while sitting on a bench waiting for the bus to arrive when he opens a box of Russell Stover Chocolates and says, "My momma always said, life is like a box of chocolates, you never know what you're gonna get."

In many ways Forest is right. Life is like a box of chocolates and we don't always know what we are going to get. However, there is one thing we always know what we are going to get, and it's God's love. *Malachi 3:8* gives us these words, *"For I am the Lord, I do not change..."*



God's love for us is unbreakable and unchanging. May God's love be with you.

From the Board Chair

The Branson Christian Church general board held it's first board meeting of the year on January 21. We had excellent attendance and a lot of enthusiasm for the new year and what we would like to get accomplished. Below are the highlights of the meeting:

We had two committee recommendations; one from the personnel committee and another from the worship committee. The personnel committee brought forth a recommendation that we split the church office duties; one person performing the duties of administration assistant ----which would be Jackie Brown, and another person handling all the financial matters of the church----which would be Ginger Faragher. The committee felt like this new approach was needed to make our office run more efficiently. The board agreed, and approved the recommendation.

The worship committee recommended that we place hymnals back into the pews. Several folks have requested this be done now because it would help them be able to read the music as well as the lyrics as we sing along during the worship service, since many of the songs are unfamiliar to the congregation. The committee felt like this could be done in a safe manner at this time, because the hymnals will only be touched once a week, and most folks sit in the same pews anyway. The board agreed and approved the recommendation. We are currently using two different hymnals: The Chalice and also Hymns for the Living Church. Both will be available in the pews for your use.



Thank you, Lord! I was so comforted by how God moved. As He has promised us, He would be with us, and He was with that situation, and is with everything we face today and the days to come!!!


With the bathroom project near completion, we will begin thinking about Phase 2 renovations. There are many things to consider, so if you have any ideas or suggestions, please contact me.

Pastor Message

Jesus told a parable about a Pharisee and a Tax Collector. "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men-extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' "And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!" "I tell you; this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Luke 18:9-14



This is the season of Lent. A time when we are to look at ourselves and consider whether we exalt ourselves or whether we humble ourselves before God.

"There's nothing wrong with me," the man says. "But sir, you've just been in a terrible car accident. You're bleeding and have some deep bruises. There may be internal damage!" "There's nothing wrong with me!" "At least have a doctor check you out sir. We have an ambulance right here - it wouldn't take very long" "I told you, there's nothing wrong with me." "But sir." Then the man walks away from the car accident. His wife picks him up and drives him home. Later he dies from internal bleedina."

The Pharisee and the man in the car accident represent a picture of what Lent is not. They represent what it means to be proud. The humble tax collector is a picture of lent. Lent is a time of honesty and humility as we confess our sins to God. For things we have done wrong and the things we know we should have done but chose not to. But Lent is also a time of relief and joy, knowing that our sins have been forgiven when we repent to Him, and are willing to serve God.

During the seven weeks of Lent, we can take time to look into our heart. Perhaps we may choose to give something up or do something special for others. Whatever you choose, may God's love be with you as you begin your own Lenten journey.

From the Board Chair

Greetings to the congregation of Branson Christian Church. I hope this letter finds you warm and comfy----and completely thawed out from the freezing temperatures. I spent a few years in Alaska back in the 60's and I thought for a while that I was trapped in some sort of time warp---because it sure felt like I was back in the Artic.

By all accounts, things are going quite well at Branson Christian Church. We are not back to full strength, but we're gaining with each passing day. We all long for the day when we can all come together without any fear or concern----and I believe that day will come.

The general board held the February meeting last Thursday and I would like to share some of the highlights from that meeting:

We discussed church security and of how we might better handle any situation that might arise in our church. We have discussed this before, and we have decided to take it a step further. Jamie Haage, along with other men in the church, will meet with local law enforcement folks this week to discuss means, methods, and training to develop a plan to keep our church as safe as possible.

Rod Phillips came to the meeting and brought forth a proposal to get a small choir back and running-----and in a safe manner. He was very articulate in explaining how this could be done and still abide by the local mandates. The board members were quite enthused by this report and we hope to see Rod and the choir back soon----hopefully sometime later this month.

The <u>thrift shop committee announced that a meeting will be held on **Saturday, March 13, at 2PM** in the fellowship hall to discuss the future of the thrift store. All volunteers and anyone that would like to be volunteer are encouraged to mark their calendars-----and attend that meeting---if at all possible. Important decisions will be made at that meeting.</u>

I don't have the space here to share all the proceedings, but all the committee chairs gave reports from their particular committee. Our church key policy, which was approved by the general board last year, is now being implemented. This policy, by the way, is a critical part of church security. All current key holders are required to sign a form that is a part of the policy. Many have already done so. 
Pastor Message

Have you ever known anyone who was always late? Well, there is one appointment they will not be late for. The Bible says, "And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment."

Hebrews 9:27

According to the Bible there is a date when we will leave this earthly life, and for those in Christ their name is written in the Book of Life which signifies they will be going to heaven.

Imagine if you will, that the angel Gabriel paid a visit to your home and laid the Book of Life on your kitchen table when no one else was in the house but you. Gabriel would say to you that you have one hour to decide whether or not you want to open the Book of Life and see if your name is written in it and the date you will be leaving this earth. From the Board Chair

Greetings, Branson Christian Church members and friends. We are so glad to have each one of you as part of our family. I trust that the month of April was kind to you---and the month of May will be even better. In all my years living in the Ozarks, I don't recall ever seeing a more beautiful spring. The dog-woods are fuller, brighter and whiter than I've ever seen. And the redbuds----Wow!!!

Our monthly board meeting was held on Thursday, April 15. We had a good meeting, and quite lengthy. We did go through our regular routine with committee reports, but the main topic under discussion was the lifting of the facemasks mandate by the Board of Aldermen in Branson. All of our board members were encouraged to express their views on how the church should move forward. After a long floor discussion, the board voted to do the following:

1. Lift our existing facemask requirements on church property. The choice will now be left up to each individual whether they want to wear a facemask or not.

2. Lift our existing requirements on the 6' distancing rule.

3. Begin the process of moving back toward regular communion. This will be a slower process taken a step at a time. As an example, the communion elements will not be passed around for some time; we will continue to use the pre-packaged method. We do plan to engage the elders in some way---and that method is yet to be determined.

4. Open the fellowship hall------however, the exact date is yet to be determined. There are a few issues that need to be resolved.

5. Return to our regular bulletin. A few bugs will have to be worked out so the exact date is also to be determined.

For over a year now we have all struggled through this. Our goal at Branson Christian Church has always been to survive this epidemic together and to keep everyone as safe as possible. People are desperate for normality-----we are starting to see light at the end of that long tunnel. So hold on, dear church family-----this could be the best year ever!!

The thrift store committee met on Saturday, April 10, and decided on a plan to reopen the store. Diana Rice agreed to stay on as Committee Chair until the end of the year, and Judy Adams has agreed to do the scheduling, along the help of the Roger Kauffman family. We also had several new volunteers. This is great news, and I'm sure the thrift store will be successful. Judy Adams has shown excellent organizational skills in this process, and we all are grateful for her willingness to dedicate her time and energy to take on this demanding task. GO THRIFT SHOP---WE ARE EXPECTING GREAT THINGS!!!!!!

Space will not permit me to go into greater detail about the meeting, but I can assure you that the church board continues to work diligently on your behalf. Our goal is to serve the congregation and to make Branson Christian Church better and better as the days go by.

Pastor Message

The Bible tells us the story of why Jesus came into the world and how he redeemed us. It begins with original sin when Adam and Eve were tricked by Satan and were disobedient to God's command to not eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Genesis 3:15 (New King James Version) tells us a prophecy of what is going to happen:

"And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel."



God is talking to Satan and telling him that from this point on there is going to be enmity, i.e., war. From that time forth there will be two kingdoms: the kingdom of God and the kingdom of the devil and they are still in conflict to this day.

The war will be between Satan's followers and "her Seed." Who is "her" and who is the "Seed?" The "her" is the virgin Mary. The "Seed" refers to the Messiah, Jesus Christ our Redeemer. Galatians 4:4 tells us, "But when the fullness of the time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of a woman . . . " "He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel." Satan bruised the heel of Jesus on the cross. However, when Jesus rose from the grave, He bruised (crushed) Satan's head. Satan was defeated at the cross and his doom is predicted explicitly in Revelation 20:10, "The devil, who deceived them, was cast into the lake of fire . . . "

Due to Adam and Eve's fall from grace, their dominion of "every living thing that moves on the earth (Genesis 1:28) which God had given them authority over, was taken by Satan. Paul refers to Satan as the "god of this world" many times, e.g., II Corinthians 2:4.

To make this even more thorough, examine the "Temptations of Christ" found in Luke, especially Luke 4:5-6, "Then the devil, taking Him up on a high mountain, showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. And the devil said to Him, "All this authority I will give You, and their glory; for this has been delivered to me, and I give it to whomever I wish." So, who delivered all this authority to Satan? It sure was not God. Satan took it from Adam and Eve at their fall from grace when original sin came into the world.

Now, the coup de gras is delivered in Matthew 28:18, when Jesus, after resurrecting from the dead and immediately before ascending to heaven, says His last words on earth, which is called the Great Commission . . . All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth . . ." This means that Satan has none. Jesus, as the second Adam, has taken back the authority that the first Adam had lost.

And so, this is how the scheme of redemption happened. Our Redeemer lives and to Jesus goes all the power and glory, forever and ever.

Pastor Message

The Thirty Year's War was a violent and ruthless time on the European continent. From 1618 to 1648, Europe and especially Germany was devastated by famine, disease and destruction. In 1636, Martin Rinkart, a Lutheran pastor in Eilenburg, Germany, wrote the hymn, "Now Thank We All Our God," a hymn of thanksgiving still sung today.

On the eve of this great war, Martin Rinkart was sent to minister to the town of Eilenburg. He was also a well known musician and writer. In 1637, the plaque came and was destroying the town as thousands died that first year. All of the clergy either ran away or died and he was left alone to minister. He performed more than four thousand funerals that year. One of them was his wife. Following all of this came devastating famine, and even in the midst of poverty, Rinkart shared food with all he could help.

Pastor Rinkart decided to write a hymn, but what kind of song could possibly come out of such dire tradedy? A lament? A plea for vendication? A cry for mercy? Instead, he wrote a hymn of gratitude. Nun Danket Alle Gott ("Now Thank We All Our God.") The Lord had spared him and even sustained him through this terrible time of war, pestilence, and famine. The song that sprung from his heart was that of thankfulness.



Now thank we all our God with heart and hands and voices, who wondrous things has done, in whom his world rejoices: who from our mothers' arms has blessed us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today. O may this bounteous God through all our life be near us, with ever joyful hearts and blessed peace to cheer us, to keep us in his grace, and guide us when perplexed, and free us from all ills of this world in the next." All praise and thanks to God the Father now be given, the Son and Spirit blest, who reign in highest heaven the one eternal God, whom heaven and earth adore; for thus it was, is now, and shall be evermore.

Wherever you are this year and whatever your situation, know that you are loved by God. I encourage you to be inspired by this account of Pastor Rinkart, and to know that this hymn was composed as a bold statement of faith.

On behalf of Branson Christian Church and staff, may God bless you richly this Thanksgiving.
