

Many hands make light work!

The phrase "many hands make light work" is not a direct Bible verse, but the principle it represents is illustrated in several biblical passages, particularly in Exodus 18:22 and the book of Nehemiah chapter 3. In these instances, a large, difficult task is made more manageable by having many people work together. The principle of people working together for a common goal is also found in the New Testament, for example, in Ephesians 4:16, which speaks of how the body of Christ functions when each part helps the others.

Christian Ed is in search of several people to help!

- ~ A Sunday School Teacher for the younger class from 9:15am until 10:15am(All of the curriculum is already set up, this is needed for the 3rd Sunday of every month). ~ A Hall Monitor for the Education Wing during Sunday
- School from 9:15am until 10:15am(Ensure the safety of the youth by sitting in the hall, be there in case a Teacher needs assistance).
- ~ A Juice Helper for the younger class after Sunday School in Fellowship Hall from 10:15am until 10:30am(juice is provided by the church, need to be attentive to the children, clean up any spills and so on).
- ~ An Acolyte Helper, assisting getting the Acolyte in their robe, lighting the Acolyte stick and hanging the robe & stick back up. Then retrieve Acolyte for end of service doing the same as before.
- ~ A Children's Worship, Wonder & Welcome Storytellers and Greeters, during regular church services. Training is needed for this, that will be set up after we get volunteers.
- ~ A Music Coordinator for youth songs.

Requirements to fill these positions are as follows- Member of the Church, Have both a Federal Background check and a State Background check. Please see Pastor Don for any and all questions regarding this.
