

# ~Christian Action Ministries~

Christian Action Ministries (CAM) recently established an Advisory Board comprised of representatives from local churches. The board will meet quarterly with the purpose of improving communication about CAM operations, funding, events, and engage congregations to volunteer and support the ministry.

The first meeting was held on August 19. They shared lots of information with a summary listed below:

CAM experienced budget cuts earlier this year and have made necessary adjustments to staffing, budget and programing to continue to provide food assistance to our neighbors in need in Taney and Stone Counties.

The main CAM location is at 2400 St. Hwy 165 which houses operations, warehouse and client food distributions. There is also a pantry in Forsyth and the Neighbor2Neighbor mobile distributions provided in several locations each month. They serve over 7,000 individuals monthly with the majority being families, with at least one person working in the household and seniors, individuals over the age of 60.

There is a community garden located at the main location that provides seasonal fresh produce. Most of the food is purchased through Ozark Food Harvest at a reduced rate and several received donations from several local grocery stores and businesses to help keep the shelves full. Examples of food that is provided are: eggs, milk/dairy products, meat, non-perishable items, bread, hygiene items/cleaning supplies and diapers. They noted their most needed donations are peanut butter and baby items diapers, wipes, etc. Of course, all donations are welcomed.

September is Hunger Action Month. Several events are planned to include "Cram the Van" sponsored by BCC...see details in the newsletter.

CAM received a \$11,500 matching Hunger Challenge grant from Ozark Food Harvest. The "Tackle Hunger Tailgate" fundraiser will be held Monday, September 8 from 5:30 - 7:30 at 2400 State Hwy 165. Plan to attend to enjoy fellowship, food and games (\$10 fee for food). Scan the QR code for more information and hope you can plan to attend.

October 1 "Tee Up for Hunger" golf tournament will be held at Ledgestone contact laney@christianactionministries.org for details.

The annual fundraiser "Festival of Trees" will be held at The Landing October 31 – December 6.

More information will be shared closer to the event.

# ~Highlights from the Board Meeting~

- Approved funding to replace the sanctuary window blinds.
- Approved funding to add privacy window coverings to the Worship and Wonder classroom window and back entrance door.
- Approved funding to upgrade the CDM Membership Module. CDM is the accounting software
  we use and adding this option will expand capacity to better manage our membership list, etc.
- Church and Thrift Store property insurance is due for renewal in September. The Trustees reviewed coverage with the insurance representative and recommended renewal without any changes.
- Recent meeting with the City of Branson representatives to discuss shared landscaping responsibilities. The areas they are responsible for have been trimmed and new mulch added. Parking issues were also discussed. We have been in touch with the Convention Center and will try to improve communications regarding large events that impact parking spaces for Sunday services.
- Committees will be working on budgeting plans for 2026.
- Committees are busy with upcoming events and plans that are shared in the newsletter.
- Kudos to everyone who helped prepare the church school classrooms, agreed to teach and Rebecka Gillen for leading the effort. The lady's trio was also recognized and a recent visitor who commented on our church is the friendliest she has attended.
