Christian Ed is in search of several people to help! Without volunteers the youth programs will not be able to continue...

- ~ A Sunday School Teacher for the younger class from 9:15am until 10:15am(All of the curriculum is already set up, this is needed for the 3rd Sunday of every month).
- ~ A Hall Monitor for the Education Wing during Sunday School from 9:15am until 10:15am(Ensure the safety of the youth by sitting in the hall, be there in case a Teacher needs assistance).
- ~ A Juice Helper for the younger class after Sunday School in Fellowship Hall from 10:15am until 10:30am(juice is provided by the church, need to be attentive to the children, clean up any spills and so on).
